Seal 1: Memory; Invocation of Ancestors and/or Review of Past and Present Lives (Formation of the Mind), for example: the Lineage of the author, D. B. Smith.

Through his mother, Smith is descended from the Trimbles,

The Scots-Irish family of Augusta Virginia

At the time of the American Revolution,

A branch of the Scottish border clan of Turnbull,

Relocated by the Crown in the eighteenth century

For perpetual violence upon the English in Northumbria.

Through his father Smith is descended

From founders of old Schenectady, Albany, and Manhattan, New York families:

Albert of Petten, and William McDuffee;

As well as founders of the island of Manhattan,

The Dutch Symon Symones Groot

And Harman Albertse Vedder,

And the Walloon Phillipe DuTruax.

# Also through his father Smith is descended

From the religious leader of the Mayflower Pilgrims, William Brewster,

Who penned the Mayflower Contract, the prototype for the United States Constitution,

As well as founders of New England (Hartford and Stonington, Connecticut),

Thomas Lord and Thomas Stanton.

Thomas Stanton, the son of Thomas Stanton and Katherine Washington,

Was the translator who oversaw all official trade between

The Native Americans and the New England colonies.

His mother Katherine was daughter of Robert Washington.

Ancestor of the first President of the United States of America, George Washington.

From Robert Washington he is descended

From Gospatrick, Earl of Northumbria, Earl of Dunbar.

His father Maldred, his father Crinan the Thane, and the earls and kings of Northumbria.

Through Mark Anthony he is descended from Mark Antony II, Mark Anthony I

And their ancestor Harakles or Hercules who became immortal,

And Julia daughter of Roman Consul Lucius Julius Caesar III author of the Julian Law,

Seal Two: The Astral; The Human Spiritual Body

- 1. ACTUAL UNIVERSE; Science: the actual universe that the observer perceives and misperceives.
- 2. GOOD; Religion, Ethics, Politics: feeling and will; the character and emotions of the observer, acknowledged by honor and respect.
- 3. LAW; Logic: reason or understanding; imagination, knowledge, memory, world-view; the observer's grasp of reality, truth, and law.
- 4. PERSONAL GOD; Metaphysics: intuition; the observer's personal god or inner guide. This is the observer's intersection with the eternal One, the foundation of the observer's logic.
- 5. COMMUNICATION; Communication: this is the observer's social entity.
- 6. PURIFICATION AND WORLD-VIEW; Hyper-Awareness (Awareness of Awareness): awareness is the defining attribute of the observer (which does not imply a waking state of consciousness), self-awareness is the foundation of self-knowledge, awareness of awareness is the observer's foundation of absolute truth.
- 7. ONE; Sacred Honor: any state of combination of states of the above seals that identify with and act on behalf of the eternal One.

Seal Five: The Mathematic; Logical Expression of Self-Awareness (Sacred Geometry)




#### 3. I Am?

Two Points, joined by an invisible line.




### 4. I Am?

Seal Six: The Sublime Being or Inner Guide

Once the alchemist has eliminated preference of feeling and thought, he is at the summit of consciousness; objective and indifferent interpretation of things and events; pure consciousness. The consciousness is the same as imagination because any image we receive from the external world is filtered through our own personal lens of experience and expectation.

To return to metaphors, consciousness is like a mirror which always has a reflection of images upon it. What does the mirror look like with no reflection? What is pure consciousness with no impressions? There is no such thing. But a mirror can reflect another mirror, what is the image, then? *Then the reflection is empty*. Like this phenomenon, the consciousness must reflect or imagine only itself, *then the imagination is empty*. This emptiness is pure awareness. Pure awareness is free of expectation.

Your own consciousness, unformed and void, your intellect luminous, your heart in peace and bliss, this is enlightened being, the Inner Guide or Immortal Emperor or Empress.
